As we enter into the last few weeks of spring and enter into the summer months, I want to thank you all for your commitment and devotion to the mission and ministries of this faithful parish. This has been a full and successful "program year", but this is not the end of our ministries...many are just gearing up. We will have Vacation Bible School, Mission Trips, Outreach opportunities, and a variety of fellowship opportunities.

Yes, we have done good work this year and the summer will not be a respite from our call to worship, serve, and share our faith. The summer takes on a different tone, but it is full of opportunities to practice the faith we proclaim. Ministries shift into a different gear, but they do not stop.

Remember that we have four services on Sunday and two services on Wednesday. These are offered to meet the needs of our members, and I pray you take advantage of at least one of them every week.

Know that I will be praying for you all as you travel, as you rest and get some "play-time". Please remember to pray for others and their time away.

When you are in town remember that your home parish needs you and do not vacate worship. When you are out of town, worship in another parish (and bring me their bulletin – I love seeing what other parishes are doing).

Pray for the summer ministries of Trinity. The Church never takes a vacation.

HORNER'S CORNER

More Rohr

I hope the title of this writing dissuades none of you faithful readers from reading on. Yes, there is another Richard Rohr book that I am recommending/reviewing, *Immortal Diamond*.

I have become enamored/impressed/overwhelmed by his writings over the years and want to share them and encourage you to immerse yourself in his scholarship.

Richard Rohr has been reading, teaching, writing and speaking for many years from a Benedictine spiritual perspective. He has written more than 20 books and founded a center for study, discipline, training, and spiritual growth in Albuquerque, NM.

In one of his earlier books, *Falling Upward*, he talked about the **ego** (part of the false self) and how it inhibits spirituality, especially if the **ego** drive continues into the second half of life. This second half can be the time for real growth as the drive for success and fortune perhaps recede and there is time for contemplation and meditation about eternal questions like "Who Am I and Who is God?"

If there is a False Self, is there then a True Self? What is it, how is it found, why does it matter and how does it impact our spiritual journey. There are several well-known spiritual giants/writers such as Thomas Merton and Basil Pennington who wrestle with these issues.

The book title, *Immortal Diamond*, helps define the True Self buried deep within us, formed under the pressure of our lives...it must be searched out and separated from all the remnants of the **ego** that surround it. The True Self then must be resurrected, like Jesus and that's the transformation we seek.

As one who has doubts, and questions the proper interpretation of Scripture (like myself) Richard Rohr reaches me when he tries to clarify tough issues, with many Bible verses, viz, the disciples didn't believe in the Resurrection (*Mark* 16:11-15) and that helps convince me that doubt is a very real important component of faith.

This leads to the challenge of, who will "roll away the rock" and expose the truth and help disbelief, who will help us in digging for the immortal diamond?

I hope I have given enough flavor of the book so you might find it appealing as a help in quiet reflection and perhaps discussion in a small group setting.

We all might well be relaxing in a Post Lent quiet time but the truth is elusive and the prize is great...and so we labor on!!!

The child was almost lost until an intervention produced the first rehab clinic. I've got to ask you which person you would rather be.

OUTREACH

Wonderful people of Trinity Episcopal,

Greetings (again) from Grahamstown! With the eighth month mark approaching, I've learned that time is a funny concept; it does not feel like I have been in South Africa for so long. Nevertheless, there is plenty I'd like to share with you:

I've become one of the head teachers for Sr. High Sunday School. Every other week, I meet with them after Eucharist to discuss the sermon and scripture readings. After class, several people stay behind to chat with me and a few monks; they often bring their own 'God questions' which we all discuss for example, a person was once curious about speaking in tongues.

When the school year began in January, I transitioned with my students from grade R (kindergarten) to grade One. In addition to the laptop and English classes mentioned before, this grade also entails quarterly report cards. We filled our first wave of reports two weeks ago, where I was tasked with marking each student's progress on oral, phonic, reading, and pronunciation competency in English, in addition to providing overall comments. While slightly tedious, these reports also served as reminders of how much work goes into teaching a student.

Holy Week at the Monastery was solemn and inspiring. During the triduum, the typical pre-service bell ringing was replaced with a handheld woodblock, and there was rarely a sound outside of the prayer services, especially on Good Friday when there were no meals, and it was officially a day of silence. Easter Sunday involved a 5 AM vigil taken straight out of the 3rd century, complete with the eight readings, lighting of the fire, renewal of baptismal vows, and procession to the chapel where we heard the melodic church bells once again. Lunch that day was a true delight, regarding both the food and the camaraderie.

We are currently enjoying a break from school, where I've learned yet again the value of rest and relaxation. Our second quarter of school begins on Monday and lasts until mid-June. I will most likely return to the US during the third quarter, meaning the next ten weeks could be the last significant amount of time I spend with students. It is surreal to think about. That being said, we anticipate there being plenty to keep us busy during the school day, so I ought to be plenty focused during my remaining time here.

Thank you all for reading this! As always, please ask questions and offer any feedback you would like. I enjoy hearing the updates from home, and I look forward to seeing you all later this year.



Here I Am....Again

I had the privilege of conducting chapel at LOTS on the Feast Day Of The Annunciation. The gospel reading assigned for the day was Luke 1:26-38. It tells the story of the angel Gabriel announcing to the young and yet unwed Virgin Mary that among other things "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

Here am I, the same phrase we used as a stewardship campaign theme two years ago; a phrase of comment to God's call. It was Abraham's response to God's call to sacrifice. It was Moses' response to God's call to save the Hebrews in Egypt. It was Isaiah's response to God's call to save his people from idolatry and sin. It is a response of personal commitment to God.

How do you commit to God's call in your life? How do you respond to the message of salvation through Christ's resurrection? Is your response *Here am I*?

Senior Warden Report

In late February, I had an opportunity to tour Trinity's property with Joanne Welker, our Junior Warden. As you may know, the Junior Warden has the responsibility of overseeing Trinity's extensive physical plant operations and maintenance; everything from routine cleaning and landscaping to emergency repairs of our aging air conditioning system, and periodic responses to building flooding/water problems. Not only was I impressed with the complexity of our building operations, but also with Joanne's proactive attitude toward the daunting task of keeping Trinity "up and running."

Each year, as our buildings continue to age, costs of maintenance continue to rise; repair of the glass blocks in the Atrium; what seems like never-ending air conditioning problems; problems with our sanctuary sound system and lighting; building water leaks; aging roofs on the buildings; need I go on?

As we drive onto our newly refurbished parking lot, courtesy of a joint effort between Trinity and The Woodlands Township, we are seeing a glimmer of the first fruits of our labor.

Even bigger things are in store for Trinity in the very near future!

Most everyone has seen the Narthex display regarding long-range plans for renovating the Trinity campus, however, you may not be aware of some behind-the-scenes efforts to bring these plans nearer term.

The Trinity Tomorrow team was formed to take up the work of the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) that was headed by Brent Stokes. This "T2" group will manage development of a master plan for the Trinity campus.


Committee members include representatives of the Vestry (Mike Thomson and Stoney Cox), former members from the LRPC for transition (Gary Darby and Tamara Salmon), as well as parish members with young families, and other congregants.

I recently signed a letter of intent to Merriman Holt Architects, indicating our interest in utilizing their services to develop Trinity's Master Plan design. Once we have secured funding for the master plan work, we anticipate the architect, in conjunction with the T2 committee, will have fully developed plans by early fall of this year. Completion of that major milestone will be a significant step toward achieving the critical enhancements of the Trinity campus that are so necessary for our continued growth and service to the community.

I am truly excited to be part of the visioning of Trinity's future, and trust that all of you share my enthusiasm, as we look back fondly at our past accomplishments, but with great anticipation toward the opportunities of the future.

Do you have questions about the Vestry and how we operate, but were afraid to ask? Are you possibly even considering serving on the Vestry someday?



Through the first two months of 2013, Trinity has a cash surplus of \$11 thousand. We benefited from the contributions in early January that were applicable to prior year commitments. Current year contributions (both pledge and non-pledge) are running below the budgeted amounts.

Expenses were generally on-target for January and February. Building maintenance and repairs remain a challenge as we address priorities to keep our facility operating safely and efficiently. We continue to look for cost savings opportunities in our operations, with the most recent example being a change to our telephone services that reduces our costs.
