

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Fridays, March 7 – April 11. 6:30 AM in the Nave, offered by the SONrise Breakfast Group. The Stations of the Cross is a traditional liturgical devotion commemorating the last day of Jesus' life. The devotion originated with pilgrims in Jerusalem retracing the traditional steps Jesus is believed to have followed on Good Friday. Since not all Christians could make pilgrimages to Jerusalem, however, the custom arose of replicating the devotion in congregational and individual settings, often with images or carvings on the walls of a church to commemorate each of the traditional 14 stations on the Way of the Cross.

FINANCIALS AT A GLANCE

Thanks to some generous giving including specific designation to pay down the Line of Credit, Trinity's ministries are on a strong footing to start the year. Here is how our year-to-date financials look through the end of January:

Our giving = \$182,651 (best January in 3 years)

Other income = \$9,480

Ministry expenses = \$181,954

Net operating income = \$10,177

Mortgage - \$2,288,572

Line of Credit - \$90,883(reduction of \$35,517 from prior month)
