## **This area of ministry includes:**

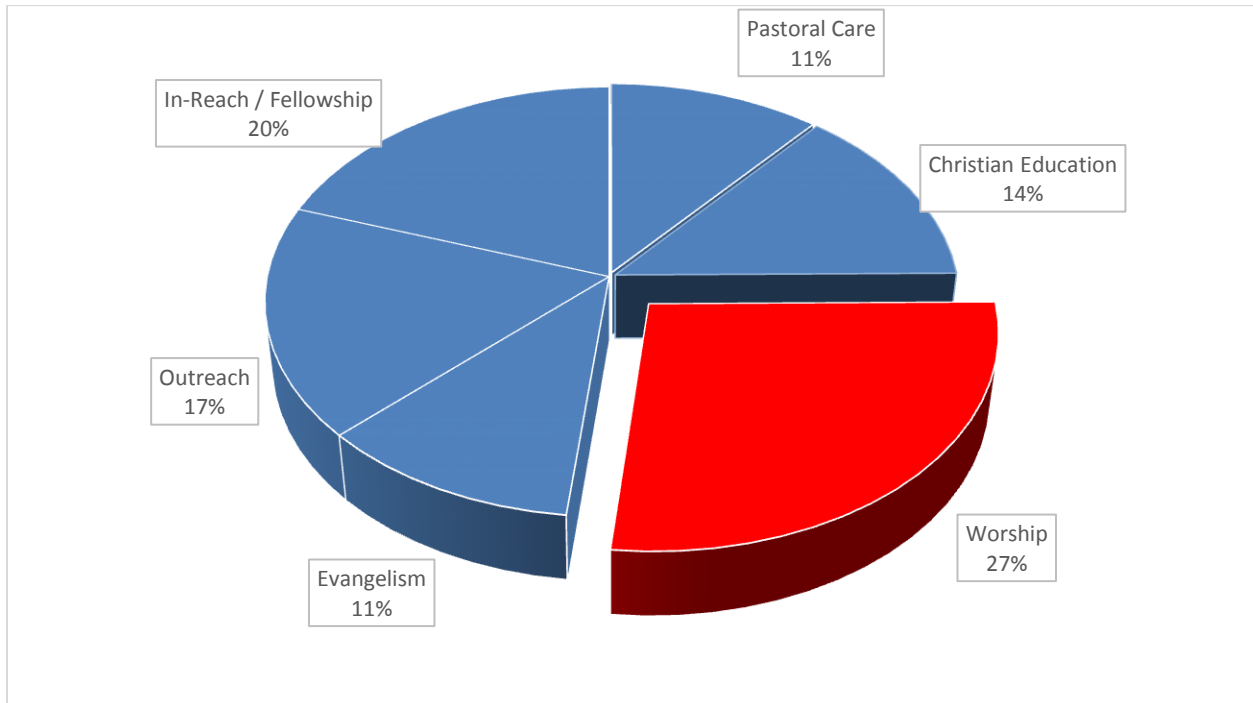
- Liturgies designed to facilitate meaningful and relevant worship

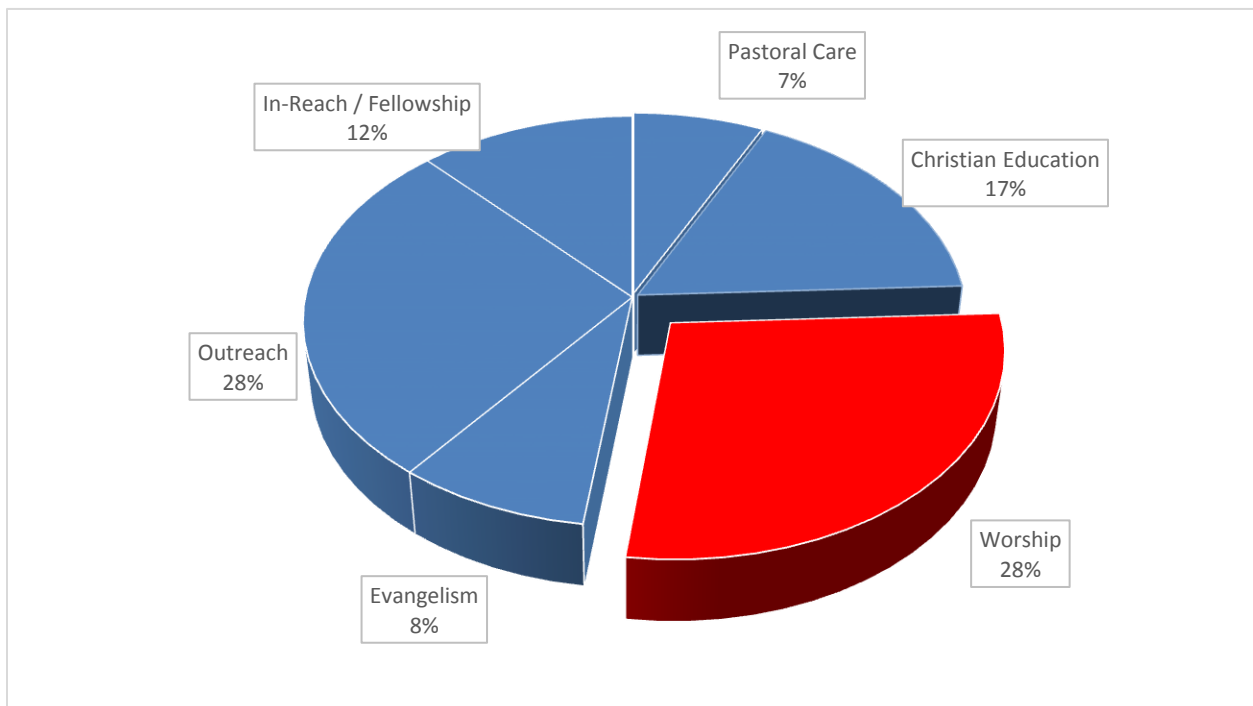

## **We are Companions... in Christian Education**

“Like newborn babes, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up to salvation.”

At Trinity we believe growth in our knowledge of God and our faith is an essential aspect of life. Opportunities for education, fellowship, sharing and service provide the environment for the development of each person's individual faith. Thus we become better equipped to share our journey with others.

### **This area of ministry includes:**

- Sunday School for children—Children's Liturgy of the Word, Two Godly Play, Teens 'N Training, and Kids for Christ
- Vacation Bible School—held during June for children ranging from 4-year-olds thru 4<sup>th</sup> graders
- Community and Coffee Talk—teenagers meet on Wednesdays and Sundays for a meal or snack, fun and age appropriate studies
- Adult Christian Formation—four adult Sunday morning classes and nine weekday classes, including Bible study classes
- Prayer group meetings
- Preparation for Baptism, Communion, Confirmation and Marriage
- Special children's events celebrating church festivals
- Daily readings and meditation for personal use

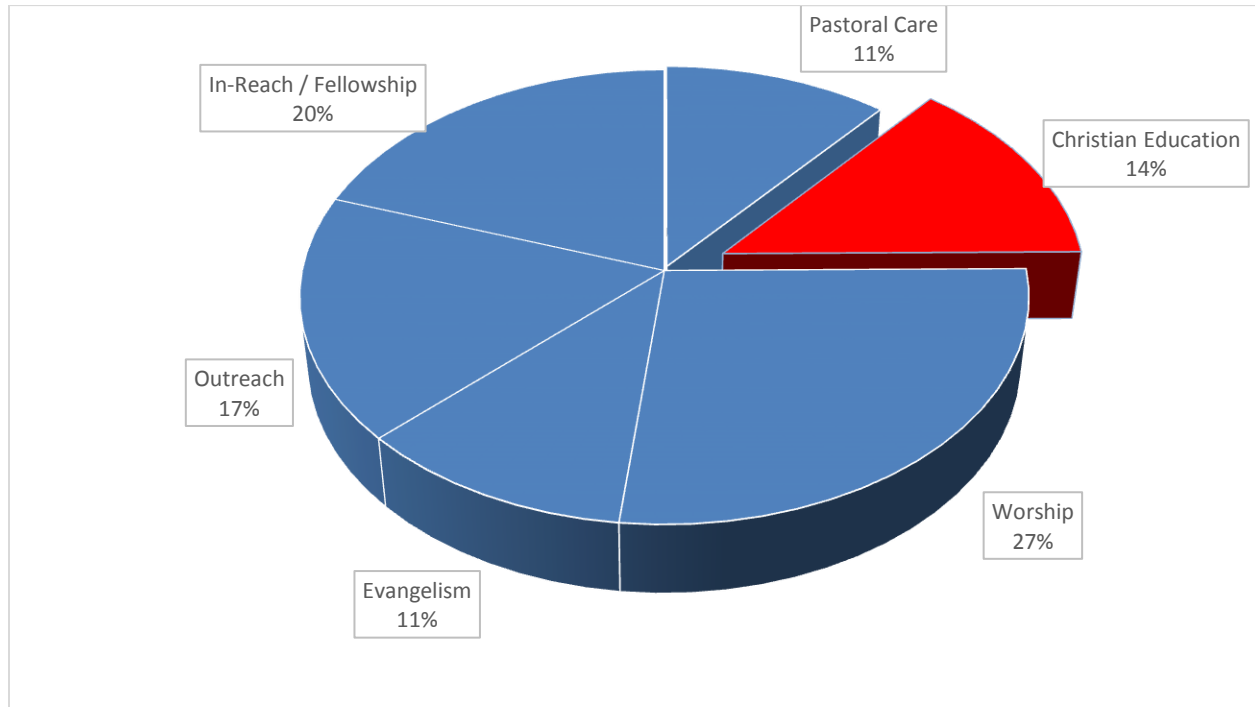

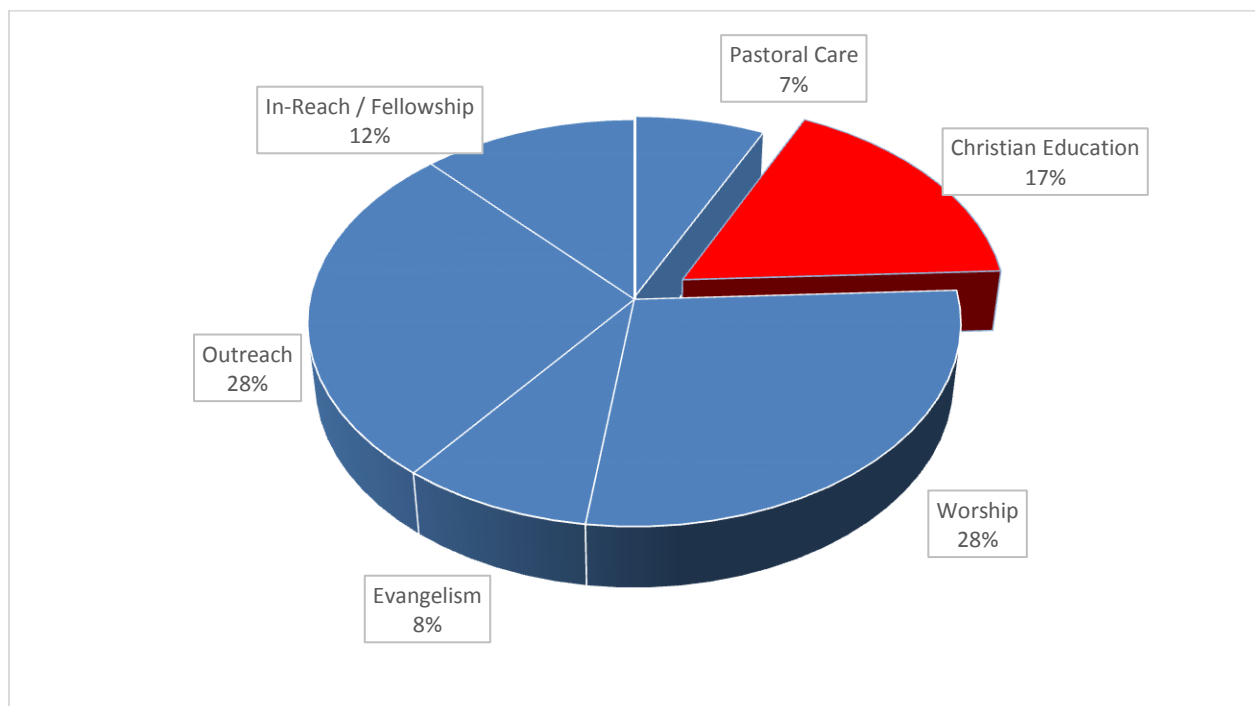

## **We are Companions... in Evangelism**

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” Matthew 28:19

At Trinity we are passionate about the faith we share. We want our church and its members to be a visible and relevant example of God’s reconciling love and justice in the world. What goes on outside the walls of this church are more important than what goes on within them. We also want to provide opportunities for those who are here to grow in an understanding of what it means to be a Christian witness on the Journey.

### **This area of ministry includes:**

- Welcoming new members and families and encouraging their involvement in the life of the parish
- Welcome Series of Sunday School classes is a 5 week program for visitors and newcomers
- Trinity Veterans Fellowship provides books and sundries to VA Hospital patients and helps fund the Fisher House veterans’ ministries
- Monthly Connections dinners to welcome people who are considering making Trinity their home church
- Bread Ministry delivers home baked bread loaves to those who have visited Trinity
- Youth community meeting at Starbucks to discuss life and faith
- Developing parish brochures and welcome packets
- Advertisements of church service schedules
- The Kids Corner provides a safe environment for children so that parents can explore connecting with various programs on the Trinity campus. On average, The Kids Corner ministers to 1,400 children per month.

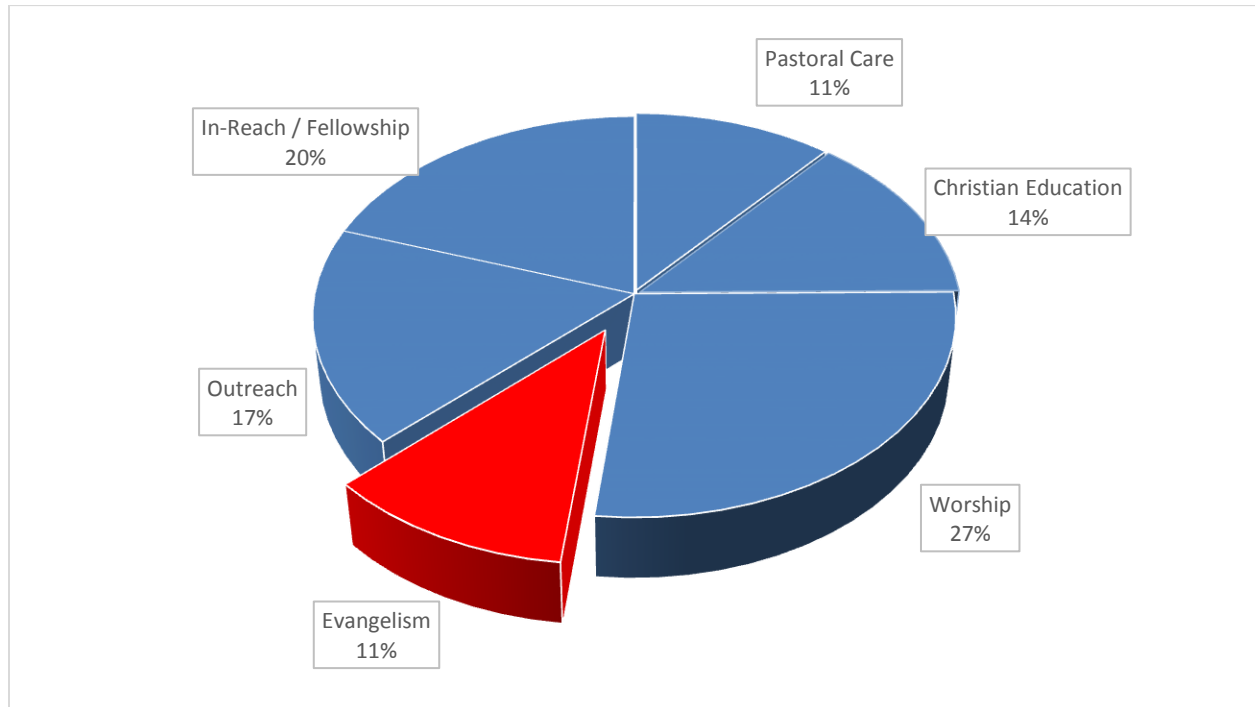
“I feel rewarded by being a part of the Trinity Veterans group that provides books, clothing, HBC items, and a myriad of other things to the Veterans Hospital.

### **A mother says...**

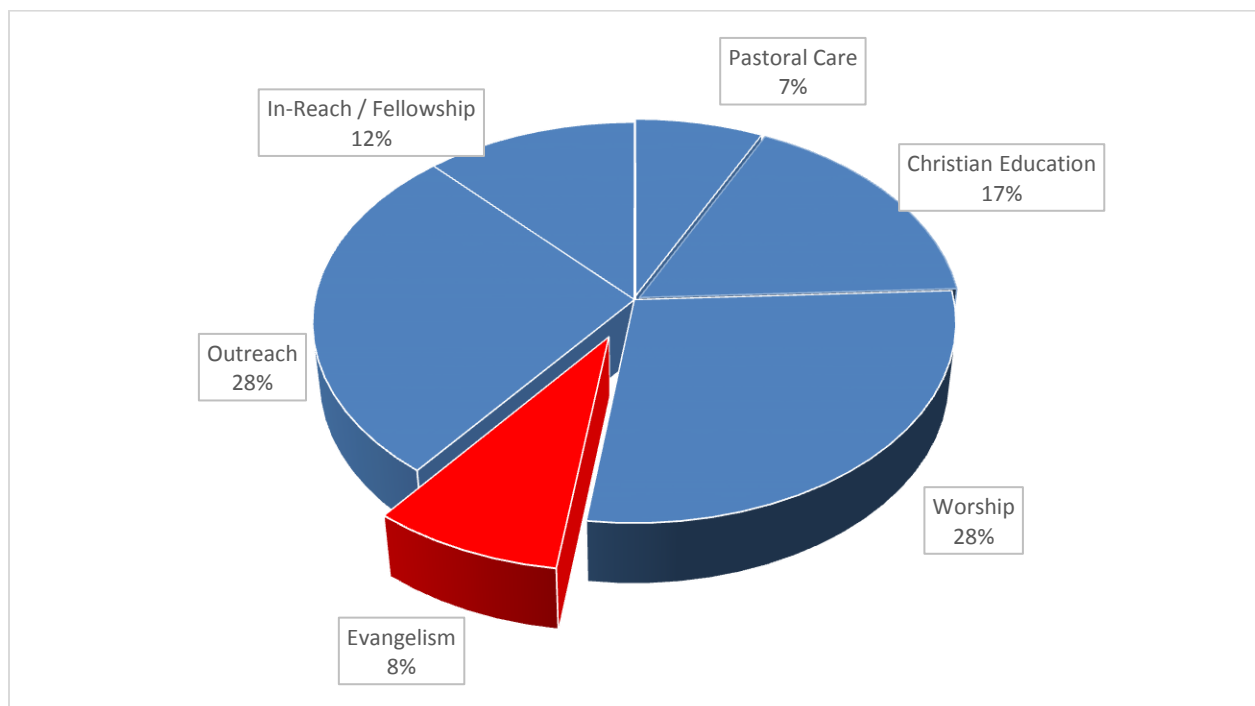

## **We are Companions... in Outreach**

“For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.” Matthew 25: 35-36

Following the example of Christ, we are a Church committed to serve and care for those who may not have any connection to our church at all. The people of Trinity strive to live out our baptismal covenant to “seek and serve Christ in all persons” in a variety of ways. We engage in outreach projects that are local, diocesan and global in focus; providing food, clothing, toys, money and many volunteers.

### **This area of ministry includes:**

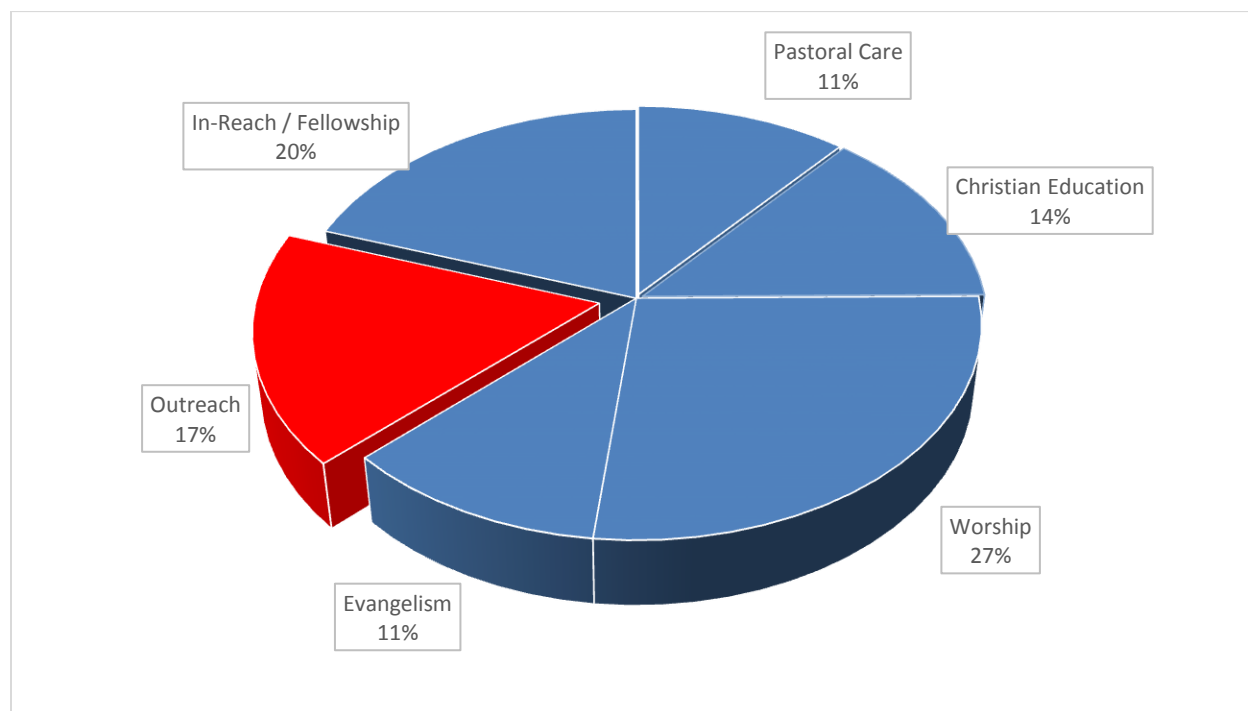
- Providing facilities for AA and other 12 Step type recovery programs
- Provide volunteers and materials to help those are hungry through programs such as Conroe Soup Kitchen, Lord of the Streets, and Interfaith Food Pantry
- Provide housing, food and support for homeless families with children through Family Promise
- Help those in prison through Montgomery County Jail Ministry
- Mentor children at risk through Kids Hope USA
- Provide volunteer labor, arts and life skills programs to St. Thomas Church at the Spirit Lake Nation reservation in North Dakota
- Church youth help those in need by doing volunteer work during youth mission trips
- Support global relief efforts through Episcopal Relief and Development
- Provide personal financial management training from a Christian perspective through Financial Peace University
- Mentor individuals who have aged out of foster care through Open Table

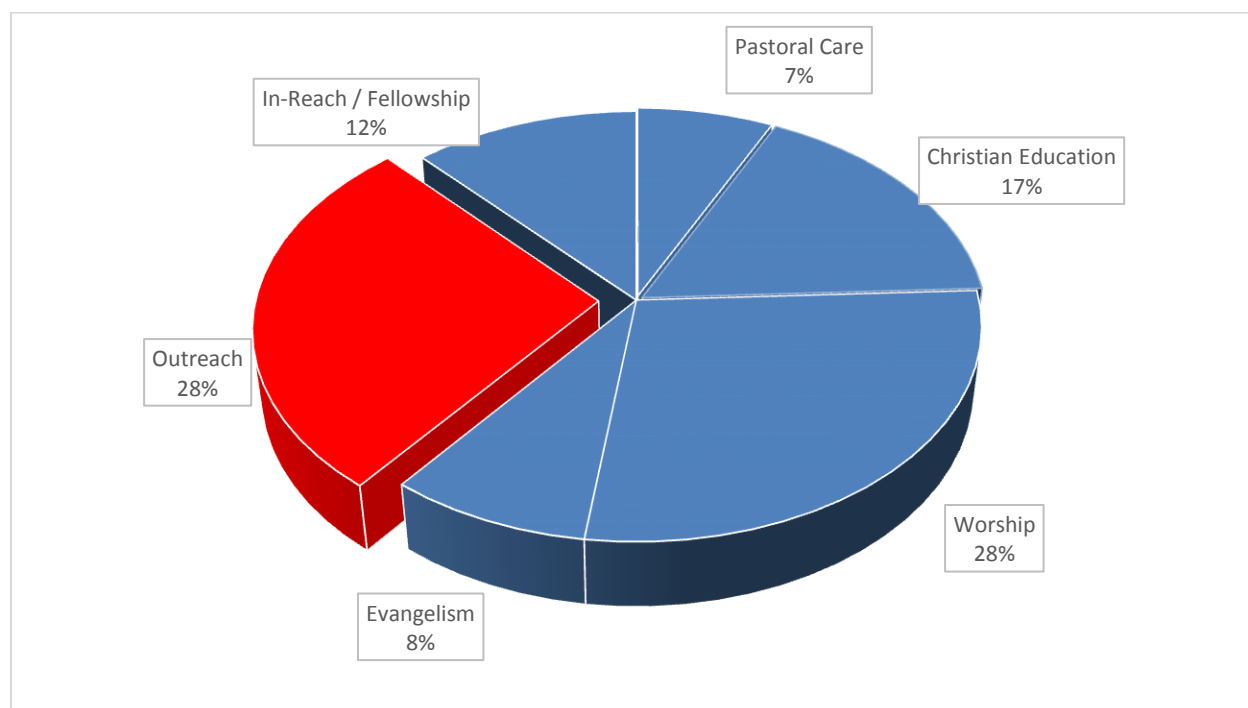

## **We are Companions... in Pastoral Care**

“As a shepherd seeks out his flock when some of his sheep have been scattered abroad, so will I seek out my sheep; and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness.”

Pastoral care includes a variety of ministry activities. Often it entails being with people in the church office, their homes, hospitals, nursing homes, and jails—wherever people with special needs are to be found. It can be comprised of crisis management, counseling, encouraging, and offering practical assistance and comfort. More than anything else, it is bringing the person of Jesus Christ into the cares and concerns of people’s lives. Ongoing spiritual guidance and support are made available to all who are open to it in whatever circumstance.

### **This area of ministry includes:**

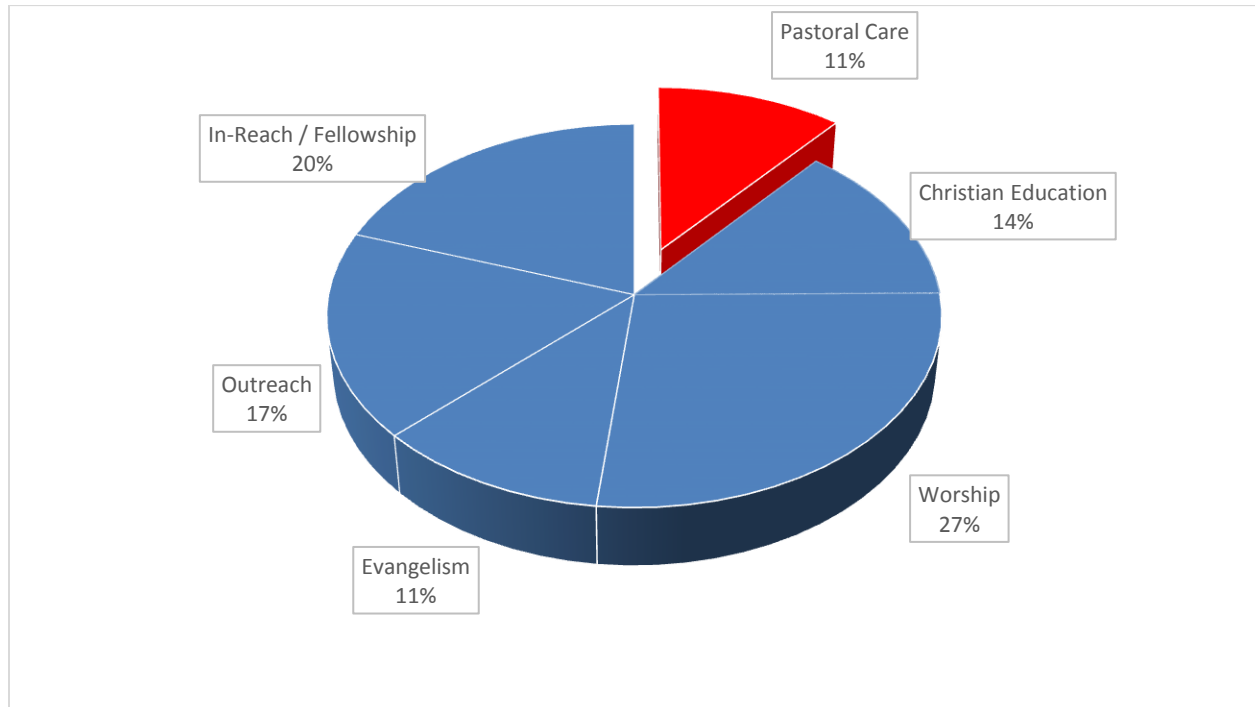
- Clergy and lay visitation for those shut-in or hospitalized
- Clergy counsel and direction on family, marital and vocational issues
- Lay Eucharistic Visitors who take communion out of Sunday service to the homebound
- Loaves and Fishes volunteers who take meals to families dealing with new babies, illnesses and hospitalizations
- Stephens Ministry volunteers provide one-on-one caregiving relationship to parishioners undergoing personal stressful situations
- Walking the Mourner’s Path provides a program for those who have lost a love one
- Prayer Chain to support with prayer those who have requested prayer for their particular situations

### **A woman whose husband recently died says...**

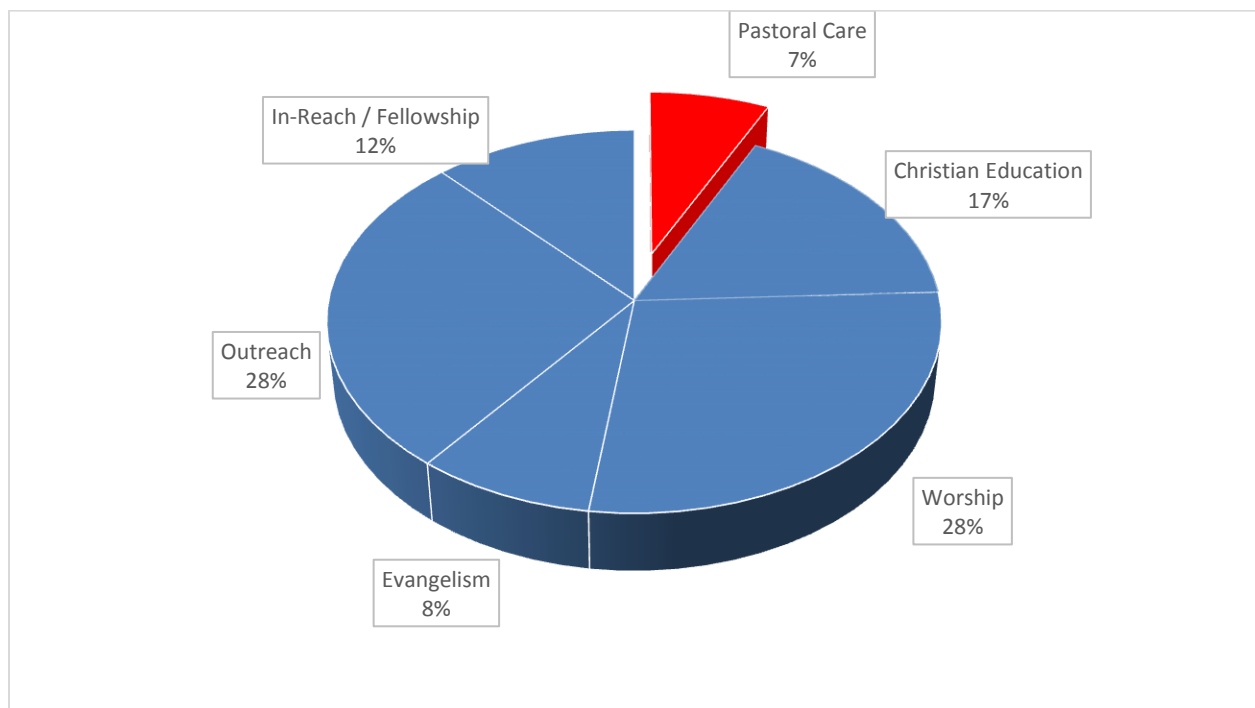

## **We are Companions... in Fellowship/Inreach**

### **This area of ministry includes:**

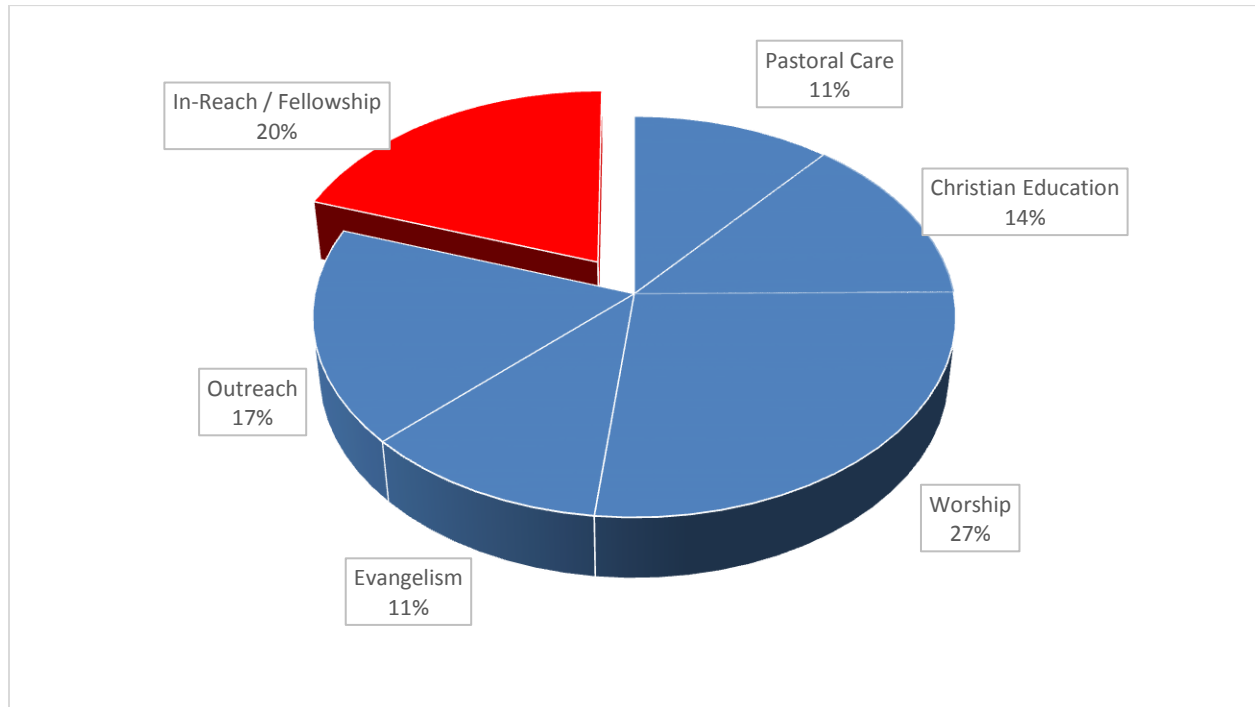
- Coffee Ministry provides coffee and snacks before and between services
- Parish communications supports community through Tidings, website, Facebook, other social media
- Holy Smokers provide monthly breakfasts and special occasion dinners
- Foyers provide fellowship over meals at parishioners' homes
- Prime Time Guys are retired men who meet monthly for fellowship and study
- St. Anne's Guild are ladies who gather monthly for fellowship and to perform service projects
- TGIF is a men's group that meets monthly for fellowship and mutual support
- ReCAPs is a group of parents with small children who participate in family friendly events of fellowship and fun
- Intergenerational events such as 50+ Wedding Anniversary Celebration, 80+ Birthday Celebration, Easter Egg Hunt, and pot luck dinners
