Dear Trinitarians,

I have been thinking a lot about beginnings recently. I love starting over when I have made a mistake. I want to reset a game or a conversation when things go wrong. I want others to forget the blunders I commit and begin again with me.

Our week begins with the gathering of Christians to worship and receive the grace found in word and Sacrament (Sunday – the first day of the week). We begin that day together in prayer.

We begin each day with a personal time of prayer and a morning routine of preparations for the rest of the day.

We are, at present, beginning the school year.

We begin the new Church year with Advent. We begin the calendar year January first.

The desire to "begin again" is a part of human nature. We are excited as we begin new jobs, we commit ourselves to new healthy habits.

The Christian life is the affirmation and the spiritual practice of the "begin anew" reality. Jesus offers us a chance to pick up and seek Him anew. We are offered the opportunity to begin again each time we humbly and honestly confess our sins. We have the opportunity as we begin the day in an act of self-offering to God. We are given the opportunity to begin anew each time we forgive someone.

To begin anew means new opportunities to love and serve. It is an opportunity to see myself and others through the eyes of God. It is not a reset or a do-over. It is a new moment for a new me.

As we begin this new school year, let us become aware of the possibilities for beginnings; with friends and family, with work and school, with Christ and His Church.

Remember the first words in the Bible? "In the beginning"? Well, you know this is not adequate to fully inform the possibility for renewal. The first words must be; "In the beginning, God..."

How will God be in your beginning anew?

Who Will Carry The Mat?

I recently heard a reading of this miracle from Mark 2, Jesus healing the paralytic, a most familiar story and this time it has stuck in my mind as I wanted to hear more of the happenings. What a metaphor for being a true friend, going the extra mile to help someone and especially to bring him to Jesus. I reflect on the question "who will carry my mat?"

I found it particularly important in meditating about this in the reaction of Jesus as He gazes upon the four mat carriers and their friend the paralytic, as they made the supreme effort to bring him to the Master. Impressed by their belief Jesus said to the paralytic "Your sins are forgiven." He also said "Get up, pick up your mat and go home."

There are so many more sermons/nuances to this parable that you can study at any time. My main point is that without the **matmen**, their friend never would have gotten to **Jesus**, and perhaps neither would they.

There is such a strong message here that I believe illustrates our roles in our lives/community.

- The healing reveals a man in need, like me.
- I am blessed with good friends who help me to come to Jesus by word and actions.
- Forgiveness and healing come only through Jesus and many times happen because of friends and church community.

This is just a note to thank so many who have expressed love and concern to me and my family concerning my brother's death. This is the joy of being part of such a loving community.

I heartily/prayerfully recommend all of us learn to share our burdens with others. I have experienced such wonderful healing amongst so many as they learn to open their hearts and share cares in a loving way and as they are able. Knowing that many are praying for them is a great healing gift.



Crossways International Bible Study - Deacon Sean



TRINITY EPISCOPAL DAY SCHOOL



ur summer is already over and TEDS is beginning its 11th year as part of Trinity Episcopal Church! Our Kindergarten children began class on August 27th and preschool begins September 4th. The current enrollment is 94; just over 20% of these children are from Trinity families. A few openings remain in several classes and we welcome inquiries. Our website, tedstw.org provides an overview of the developmental curriculum we offer. TEDS is licensed through the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services and is in its fifth year of accreditation by The Southwestern Association of Episcopal Schools.

The TEDS staff had a busy summer attending conferences and workshops in preparation for the school year. It's wonderful to see their enthusiasm growing as they begin the new year. Most of our staff has returned to the program and several have taken on new responsibilities. We are looking forward to a full and exciting time with our students and their families. One major change in our staffing this year is **Carol Black's** move from office administration to curriculum specialist. We are happy that she has chosen to remain involved in TEDS, even after 32 years in public education, four years in our 4's classroom and six years in the office!! **Dawn Bremer**, who is also a church member and was a Trinity parent for five years, has taken the administrative assistant's position.

The children will soon be settling into their classrooms and becoming acquainted with each other and their teachers. In addition to learning routines and schedules, participating in Chapel, Spanish and music/movement, they experience a wide variety of curriculum themes and classroom activities. Fall themes include: farm and bees and bears for the little ones. The three's began with "fun books" such as *Chicka Chicka Boom Boom* and *Put Me in the Zoo* and will continue on to "color" weeks. Some of the four's started with units on family and friends, and then moved on to focus on pumpkins, apples, spiders and bats. Our Explorer class, whose curriculum leads them around the world, first "trips" were to Australia and China! And the Kindergarteners are already learning sentence rules, the main idea and details of a story, phonograms of all the single letter sounds and have been introduced to place value for ones, and even and odd numbers. They are enhancing their social studies and science curriculum with National Geographic and Weekly Reader magazines.

October will bring our Pumpkin Days activities, photo days, preparation for our first parent/teacher conferences and TEDS Fest, sponsored by the TEDS school board. This great afternoon of food, fun and fellowship takes place on Sunday, October 21st. We hope you'll join us!

We want to offer special thanks to the TEDS school board for mulching the playground before the start of school, the St. Joseph's guys for all their "construction" consultation, the Trinity clergy for greeting parents, blessing backpacks and leading Chapel, and Boy Scout Parker York for his additions to our playground structures!

Trinity Veterans Fellowship

ou are one of the moving human, spiritual beings that have become part of a whole. That whole may not be apparent to you, but your contribution through religious affiliation, public service, social organization or friendship, may become visible in this smallest of recent acts:

Four years ago, a small group of individuals sat at a table in a local eatery, intent on forming a fellowship for their mutual growth and benefit. That fellowship grew and attracted more like-minded people and became the Trinity Veterans Fellowship. Through this fellowship they have continued their life of service to Christ and their country. Initially they organized and produced a weeknight service of "Recognition & Remembrance" in November around Veterans Day. A neighboring church, Lord of Life Lutheran, had a similar group of veterans and proposed combining forces for a joint annual service. This year we will conduct the third annual Veterans Day Service together. This event has raised over \$5,000 to support the needs of veterans and their families at the Houston VA hospital. This year's service will be held at Lord of Life Lutheran Church at 7 pm on Thursday, November 8, 2012. The one-hour service will be followed by a reception. The entire parish family is invited to join us to remember and honor veterans of the Armed Services.

Continuing in the spirit of ecumenical fellowship, Veterans from the Lord of Life Lutheran and Trinity Episcopal Churches recently supported the Montgomery County Veterans Service Office. Approximately seventy veterans, spouses, and widows attended this Benefits and Breakfast meeting. The highlight of the meeting was a presentation by Ms. Kay Lee of the Montgomery County Veterans Service Office providing attendees critical information about available veterans benefits. The Benefits & Breakfast was attended and supported by Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center and Woodlands Post 305 of The American Legion.

Trinity's monthly collection of non-monetary donations for the DeBakey VA Hospital, at Fourth Sunday for the Vet, continues to be a vibrant outpouring of love and has grown in total to U-Haul truck volume. Another interaction has blossomed out of Post 305's need to transport a quantity of books and magazines to M.E. DeBakey VA Medical Center. An individual who sat in the "local eatery...(with) intent on fellowship formation" recently transported that pick-up truckload for The American Legion.

We are all connected. We may not see the daily interaction. And, we do not know what connection our actions produce. We offer this short story as a tribute to your connection in fellowship and service.

Finally, we ask that you pray for those who serve, and their families –

"Almighty God, we commend to your gracious care and keeping all the men and women of our armed forces at home and abroad. Defend them day by day with your beavenly grace; strengthen them in their trials and temptations; give them courage to face the perils which beset them; and grant them a sense of your abiding presence wherever they may be; through Jesus Christ our Lord. 

Stewardship

Please walk with me for a short journey of discovery about Stewardship. For it is in growing understanding of Stewardship that I have learned most about my relationship with God. A most recent lesson is that we are all Stewards of God's gifts, the questions is whether we are good stew-

ards or poor stewards of what God has given us. A lesson that I learned a long time ago is that a tithe (ten percent) is the minimum the bible expects me to give back to God, and it should be given first. This is a minimum, so even if you do tithe it does not make you righteous. Now in this much, as in the commandments, I have fallen and continue to fall woefully short on my own merits.

This is all pretty strong stuff, and hopefully you have continued to follow me up to this point, because this is where the good news comes in. There are steps we can take to be a better steward. I started out as a random giver, a person who paid the price of admission to this Sunday's "show", when I attended, with a random amount of the cash on hand. Later the Lord moved me to be intentional about my giving and sent angels in the form of Pony Express riders to my door with a pledge card, a pen and anxious looks of concern for my soul should they leave without a completed card. Since then, I have been intentional about my commitment to give by praying, considering, and growing as I write down my commitment and share that personal commitment with my wife and the church accountant.

I have learned that it is not these works that bring me righteousness, but they do bring me into greater understanding of God's love for me. Righteousness comes from the grace of God, for God so loved the world that he gave His only Son, so that whoever believes in Him shall have eternal life. 

October Newcomers': Octoberfest



Vestry

ith the end of summer vacation season comes the chance to rethink and renew our commitments to family, friends, and our church. The commitment of time, talent, and treasure to a church mission is one that makes a real difference in the life of your fellow parishioners, the community, and your own life.

Rally Day Sunday, August 26th was your opportunity to see the range of current ministries, talk to people already involved in them, and discern what you think best fits your talents and interests. I hope you took the opportunity to sign up on the spot, but you can spend time considering and later contact the ministries that interest you. If you weren't able to participate then, please talk with a Vestry member or clergy member and they can help you find what you want. There are no deadlines to joining in our parish. And, if you don't find what you want, you can start your own ministry. For instance, BJ Ayala recently began a meditative prayer group on Sunday afternoons that has become very well attended.

The response to our new emergency fund has been fantastic, with over \$10,000 donated. This is about one-quarter of our goal, but is a great start to building a strong foundation for our future. Later in the Fall will be our annual stewardship campaign that asks for your financial commitment to the parish. This is the basis of our operating budget, and separate from the emergency fund, and provides the dollars for our buildings, staff, clergy, and outreach ministries. This is a commitment that needs particular attention from all of us. We have historically operated with a very skinny budget for a parish of over 1500 members, relying on volunteers and the efforts of parishioners, staff, vestry, and clergy to keep costs in line. As discussed in the Vestry letter to the parish in July, we are facing increased maintenance costs for our buildings along with the usual increases in costs for health insurance and other items. There have been some successes in reducing costs, such as moving The Tidings to bi-monthly and renegotiating our copier contract, but those moves have only partly off-set the added maintenance expenses and have not allowed for an annual cost-of-living increase for the staff and clergy. This last point is, I feel, very noteworthy as we all can relate to it and is a cost control measure that is unsustainable.

For those who pledge today, and have over the years, your commitment is very much appreciated. But less than 50 percent of parishioners pledge, and the normal level for an Episcopal parish is over 60 percent. That difference would not make us wealthy or frivolous, but would allow us to have the staff we need, pay them fairly, and maintain our buildings and ministries in a proper manner.

And finally, we have begun the process of selecting candidates for next year's Vestry and Diocesan Council delegates. These are positions that are important to the direction of the parish and diocese, and require thoughtful discernment to understand if they match your gifts. FINANCIALS

Through the month of July 2012, Trinity's financial results reflect a year-to-date surplus of \$34 thousand. Contributions remain ahead of the year-to-date 2011, and have been relatively strong during the traditionally slower months of Summer. We also have a good start with over \$10 thousand contributed towards our new Trinity Reserve Fund which is designated for unplanned emergencies that our Operating Budget cannot fund. Thanks to all of you for sustaining your giving throughout the Summer!


Expenses were relatively low in June, but have ticked up during July due to both seasonal expenses (e.g. timing of mission trips; quarterly insurance payments, VBS and summer child care programs) as well as higher maintenance and repairs. We will likely see some of these expenses also spill-over into August.

As we return from Summer, we find ourselves in a stronger financial condition than we were one year ago. The church continues to grow its membership as seen by our average Sunday attendance. We have an outstanding variety of ministry programs that benefit our children, our community, and our spiritual development. I hope you all will take the opportunity to consider giving of your time and talent in one of our ministries.
