I'm regularly being stretched and challenged by Richard Rohr's writings. The meditation below is a powerful example of his theology and wisdom.

Time to Grow Up

It seems to me that it is a minority that ever gets the true full Gospel....in any denomination. Most of us just keep worshiping Jesus and arguing over the right way to do it. The amazing thing is that Jesus never once says, "Worship me!" whereas he frequently says, "follow me' (e.g., Matthew 4:19).

Christianity is a lifestyle – a way of being in the world that is simple, non-violent, shared and loving. However, we made it into an established "religion" (and all that goes with that) and avoided the lifestyle change itself. One could be warlike, greedy, racist, selfish, and vain in most of Christian history, and still believe that Jesus is one's "Personal Lord and Savior" or continue to receive Sacraments in good standing. The world has no time for such silliness anymore. The suffering on Earth is too great.

164th Annual Council Report



This is my annual report on this annual event, now in it's 164th year. I believe the format has changed little in recent years. The Church Canons (rules) require certain financial reports, the Bishops State of the Diocese Address, appointments etc, and of course election

of folks to fill various official offices.

There are the resolutions and changes in the Constitution and Canons, for debate and voting upon. All in all it is a very well planned and executed two day meeting and does indeed ensure the legality and credibility of EDOT. Considering the millions of dollars in assets, and 10 million dollars annual budget, 165 missions and parishes plus over 300 clergy, it is a very important annual happening.

It is also important to note that the entire meeting was undergirded by frequent Chaplain's prayers and the required Necrology Report was read.

Trinity was well represented by ten delegates, one of the largest delegations there. There were several very important highlights, in my opinion.

The hosts for the Council were the Hispanic congregations of EDOT, a diverse and growing segment in our Diocese. What a refreshing and optimistic view to see literally hundreds of young enthusiastic Hispanics in many roles during the entire meeting, and much of the Communion liturgy was in dual language.

The introduction of newly ordained and other new clergy bodes well for the future of our diocese; maintaining staffing at our many missionary outposts is critical.

The Bishops address is always a highlight as our young, dynamic, energetic and visionary leader cast a vision and course for the future. Many new/innovative ideas were rolled out, including new church plants, enhanced Evangelism programs, and moves to increase efficiency and budgeting. There was a comprehensive report on the status of St Luke's Hospital System and probable future changes.

We all came away from this exciting experience with confidence and hope for the future of EDOT, a bright and shining beacon in the National Church.

One of our own delegates, **Walter Browning** was recognized for the celebration of his birthday and being a first time delegate.

Pastoral Care

An Invitation to Become a Pastoral Visitor In Your Hospital

It was in 1954 that St. Luke's Episcopal Hospital opened its doors in the Texas Medical Center. It has continued a significant ministry of The Episcopal Diocese ever since.

When the hospital board decided to build their first suburban hospital outside of the Texas Medical Center, they wisely chose The Woodlands. The corner of Interstate 45 and SH 242/ College Park Drive was selected for the new campus- purchasing 42 acres in 2001. This year the 10th Anniversary of the opening of The Woodlands campus is being celebrated. As members of Trinity Church you are invited to consider participating in the ministry of this special place which has become a flagship of faithful loving care in our community.

The Right Reverend John Hines said, "We shall not build just another hospital. That would be a betrayal of our commission as a Church of God. We shall build a Church Hospital in which all the mountain-moving powers of faith and prayer and human skill can be brought to bear upon individuals in need. It will be a hospital in which the Chapel will stand close to its very heart. It will be a witness to a gallant and decisive fact of human experience, namely, that 'we are children of God.""

In March of 2003, St. Luke's Community Medical Center, now known as St. Luke's The Woodlands Hospital opened its doors. The hospital opened as a general care community hospital- with 84 private patient rooms. Since that time, the campus has grown from 42 to 64 acres - and the hospital has grown to 184 patient rooms. Construction is currently under way to add another 60 private rooms in the next two years, increasing current capacity by over 30%.

In every regard the words of Bishop Hines have been fulfilled in The Woodlands. As you read about the clinical services provided in what is essentially "your" hospital realize, too, that spiritual care is offered and provided by many volunteers of your community. One volunteer who has been here from the beginning said, "Becoming a Pastoral Visitor at St. Luke's has been a wonderful experience for me. It has taught me compassion for the fears and pain of others. It has given me understanding of other people's beliefs. I have learned to see and feel God's love for all people."

When St. Luke's decided to bring their brand of Faithful, Loving Care to Montgomery County, they invited other nationally recognized healthcare providers to join them. Texas Children's Hospital (TCH) provides all pediatric care at St. Luke's The Woodlands. TCH also operates a pediatric clinic on the campus with medical doctors from 15 specialties seeing patients Monday – Friday.

MD Anderson, the #1 name in cancer care in the U.S., joined St. Luke's in The Woodlands in 2004. The MD Anderson Cancer Care Center in The Woodlands offers comprehensive oncology care close to home.

Since opening in 2003, St. Luke's added a Heart Program, bringing cardiologists and cardiovascular surgeons trained at the Texas Heart Institute to The Woodlands. In 2005, St. Luke's was the first hospital in The Woodlands to perform open heart surgery.

In 2009, St. Luke's Lakeside Hospital opened on the St. Luke's campus. A Neuroscience Program was added in 2010. In 2012 a Performance Medicine Center opened on campus, as well as a Wound Care Center. St. Luke's The Woodlands was named a Hometown Hero by Interfaith of The Woodlands for their years of giving back to the community. Two additional medical arts buildings have been added to the campus in the past seven years, bringing more physicians of all specialties to St. Luke's and to The Woodlands. In the past ten years the number of patient rooms has more than doubled from 84 to 184. The number of physicians on staff has more than tripled to 700. The number of employees at SLTW has more than quadrupled from 245 to 1,058.

As we have grown, this invitation is of great importance. It is a call to experience the healing power of God by helping people connect with their own beliefs, values, faith, and inner strengths on their journey to wholeness. As Henri Nouwen said, it is a "hard calling to accept because it goes against our own needs for self-affirmation, self-fulfillment and self-realization. It is a call to true humility." And yet, for those who accept they often find that they receive so much more than they give, and as one has said, "we are in a holy place and God is present." As so many members of Trinity Church have already discovered, this is indeed an amazing threshold to pass through.

HOLY WEEK - MARCH 24 - MARCH 31, 2013

Palm Sunday

We began Holy Week with the Procession of the Palms and the reading of the Passion (suffering) of Christ. This marks the entrance into Christianity's most sacred week.

We believe that Holy Week celebrations began early in Jerusalem and by the 4th century was an annual commemoration of His Death and Resurrection.

Holy Wednesday – 10 AM & 7 PM

We recall the work of betrayal. Judas goes to the authorities and asks what they will give him to betray Jesus. The trap is set.

Maundy Thursday – 7 PM

We remember the Last Supper, how Jesus washed the disciple's feet, and how he goes to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. It is here that Peter, James and John fall asleep while Jesus prays and he asks them could they not watch with him for one hour. Judas joins him in the garden and, with a kiss, the betrayal is complete. The Sanctuary is emptied of all its' beauty and lays bare before us.

Maundy Thursday Watch – 9 PM Thursday to 3 PM Friday

In response to Jesus' question, "Could you not watch with me for one hour?", we place the Sacrament of Bread and Wine at the Altar of Repose (in the Parlor). Members come to pray, read, and meditate on the sacrifice of Christ – responding to the question with, "Yes, I will watch with you for one hour".

Good Friday – 12 Noon and 7 PM

Jesus hangs on the cross from Noon until 3 PM. At 3 PM on Good Friday he dies. The Good Friday service recalls the fear of the disciples, the agony of Christ and his burial in the tomb. With devotions to the Cross we recall his sacrifice for each of us, remembering the high cost of God's Love.

Holy Saturday

On the Sabbath (Saturday) Jesus' body lay in the tomb. The Apostles and disciples are hiding in grief and fear. In this very short service we recall the temporary resting place for his body and our darkness as we await the Easter word.

Easter – 7 PM Saturday, 7:30, 9, 11 AM & 5 PM Sunday

The great Feast of the Resurrection begins Saturday night with the most ancient of services. We light the Easter fire for the Paschal Candle and grow from darkness to the light of the Easter Acclamation.

Sunday morning we continue to celebrate the Risen Lord, remembering that after this Easter Sunday every Sunday becomes a little Easter.

I pray you all can attend as much of Holy Week as you can. It will make Easter more joyous and meaningful. EASTER LASTS FOR 50 DAYS!

TRINITY EPISCOPAL DAY SCHOOL



We decorated our own masks and celebrated Mardi Gras here at TEDS with a parade through school, beads and all! The Lenten season will be observed; our hallelujahs put away until Easter. Rodeo Days and the annual arrival of our caterpillars signal the beginning of spring. TEDS classes will have many lessons in nature study, including metamorphosis, germination and ecology. The little guys, eighteen months and two year olds, begin their color units, while the threes focus on farm, pond, ocean and weather. Our four year old classes study Texas history, Earth Day, health and nutrition and Folk Art. The Explorer class will travel to Egypt, Africa and South America during March and April.

Here is a brief Kindergarten overview for March/April: Science-an eight week process of observing tadpoles become frogs, with DATA recorded in the "Frog Log", planting pumpkin seeds saved from October, a study of planets and the phases of the moon; Language Arts-the parts of a book including the table of contents and glossary, use of describing words and creation of a new class big book; Math:-counting coins totaling more than \$1.00, telling time to 5 minute intervals, addition, subtraction, measurement and word problems.

We have begun registration for the 2013-2014 school year. We offer classes for 18 months through Kindergarten. As of March 1, we have openings in most classes, with the exception of the three day two year olds. If you, or anyone you know, are interested in the day school, please contact the school office. Trinity Veterans Fellowship

With our nation at war, our service men and women repeatedly in harm's way, all in the Trinity family know of friends and family who are currently serving in one of our armed services. This is a particularly stressful time for these young men and women, and their families who wait, prayerfully, for their safe return. We can think of no other time when the need of spiritual blessings is more paramount.

To meet this need, the Trinity Veterans Fellowship has undertaken a mission of providing a copy of the Episcopal Church's Prayer Book for the Armed Services. This condensed prayer book, sized to fit in field uniforms, is designed for use by Chaplains and Those in Service and contains reprints from the Book of Common Prayer, The Hymnal, and other source material. Accompanying the Prayer Book is an Episcopal Church Service Cross which may be worn with identification tags (dog tags) as a reminder that the wearer is a Child of God. Providing these items to those in service continues a tradition followed by many Episcopal parishes. Several of the Trinity veterans recall receiving them while in service, the comfort they provided at a time of need, and many still treasure them today.

In addition to the Prayer Book and Cross, the Brotherhood of St. Andrew is providing another book, Strength for Service To God and Country. This book contains daily devotional material appropriate for each day of the year and tailored for those in service.

- Individually, we give generously of our time and treasure and model stewardship for others.

The vestry commits to honest, two-way communication with all members of the parish.

- We will actively seek out and understand all aspects of issues raised and offer constructive solutions that look forward towards God's call.
- We will convey a positive and consistent message through our communications, facilities, and ministries to our members, visitors and community.
- We will communicate positively and respectfully and avoid defensive, confrontational language and gossip.

Financials

We concluded the year 2012 with total revenues of \$1,636,249, nearly matching the record contributions of 2011. Expenses of \$1,659,973 were generally on-budget with the exception of our Facility expenses. We experienced a number of unplanned repairs that exceeded annual historical levels due to A/C issues, drainage repair, pest control, lights replaced in the sanctuary, fire monitoring equipment to meet standards, and removing dead trees following the 2011 drought. For the year, we ended with a deficit of \$24 thousand.

For the year 2013, the Vestry has projected overall revenues of \$1,675,000 equating to about a 2% increase vs 2012. Expenses are budgeted with an overall increase of less than 1% so that we can arrive at a balanced budget. With the help of our staff, we continue to focus on reducing administrative costs so that we can make additional funds available to support our ministries.


As we enter the new year, there remain a number of challenges, but we find ourselves with a firmer foundation. In 2012, we established the Trinity Reserve Fund which is similar to an "emergency fund" to help address unplanned facility expenses. We also witnessed the start-up of the Trinity Endowment Fund which is focused on building a fund for future generations of Trinitarians. We have seen growth as evidenced by our average Sunday attendance. On behalf of the Vestry, we thank you all for your time, talent, and treasure!
