## FINANCIALS AT A GLANCE

Through the end of September 2013, Trinity's giving is \$76,628 behind our year-to-date budget. As a result, church and ministry operations are short \$66,082. Here are the numbers as of September 30th: Budgeted Giving \$1,113,750/Actual Giving \$1,037,122. YTD Revenue \$1,333,446/YTD Expenses = \$1,399,528. A big "thanks" to those who caught-up after the summer vacation season, as we have seen the YTD financial condition improve slightly during the past month.
